Hidden conditions, which could not have been ascertained in advance, and which are not in keeping with what would have reasonably been expected, will be an additional charge to the extent that those hidden conditions cause extra expense. Hidden conditions would include such things as buried rock, water damage, mold, termite damage, pre-existing code violations and other concealed conditions. ## **App Description**

#### Form Description

Often called a T&M contract, the Time & Materials contract looks a lot like a cost-plus contract. However, T&M contracts include markup in the hourly labor rate as well as in the Overhead and Profit section, which is unique to this contract. When to Use It Most contractors hire and train their own crews. The work they perform is of their company standard, and managed and paid for by the company. You can't charge the client the employee's base pay, you have to charge his hourly rate, including labor burden and all other associated indirect labor costs, plus overhead.

#### Form Purpose

This agreement includes markup in the hourly labor rate as well as in the contractor's fee or Overhead and Profit sections.
